



## **Emergency Appeal**

The Executive Unit for IDPs-Marib Governorate is following with great concern the climate changes in the governorate. This climate change is seasonal and usually happens over the period July-August every year in this desert governorate. This year, the climate change led to hurricanes, dust storms, strong wind and heavy rain that lasted for more than four hours and led to damages in IDPs shelters. It is worth mentioning that most IDPs live in emergency shelters and shade nets that are very old and fragile. Till this moment, many IDPs shelters were heavily affected by hurricanes, dust storms, strong wind and heavy rain. In case the continuity of this climate change or increase of the intensity of dust storms, hurricane and heavy rain, the situation might worsen and lead to catastrophic situation in IDPs sites as the IDPs camps are suffering weak infrastructure and 80% of IDPs live in emergency shelters.

Accordingly, we appeal the following:

- ✤ The suc-clusters in the governorate should communicate their partners for quick intervention.
- The humanitarian partners, INGOs, NGOs and UNOCHA should intervene quickly to provide tarpaulins to save the situation. More than 60000 tarpaulins are strongly needed urgently.
- Local authorities and the political leadership are strongly appealed to perform their duties towards IDPs and response quickly to protect and assist IDPs.
