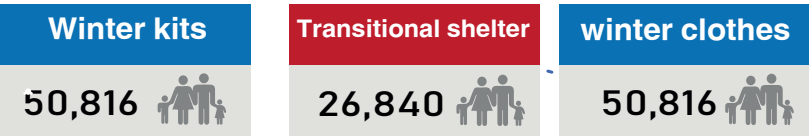


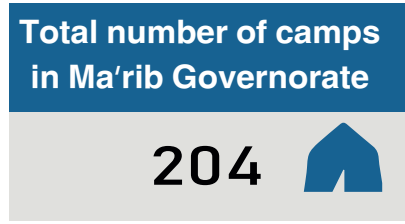
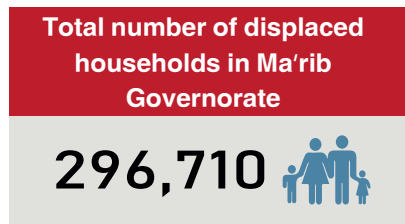
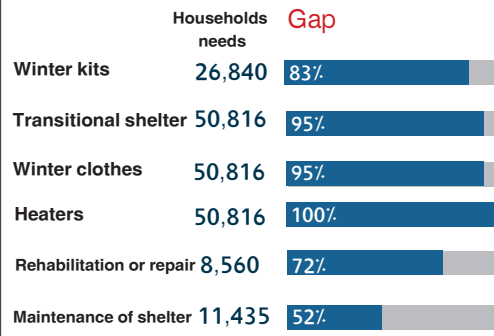
Overview of humanitarian conditions in the camps

Approaching winter of this year 2023, The cold is posing major humanitarian challenges, as the suffering of IDPs doubles in light of the tragic and deteriorating humanitarian conditions experienced by households in the displacement camps in Ma'rib Governorate, which suffer from a major lack of resources and basic infrastructure, and the shelter file is still a living witness to the suffering displaced households in camps live in tents and types of dilapidated shelter that are not equipped to withstand the difficult weather conditions in the governorate, and which do not protect the bodies of children and the elderly. So sick people can't bear the severe, deadly cold. Some may resort to using unsafe heating methods, such as open fires inside tents, which increases the risk of fires and cases of carbon monoxide poisoning. delaying and slow winter humanitarian response causes a humanitarian catastrophe in light of the exacerbation of the needs for shelter, shelter materials, food supplies, medicine, and winter supplies in the camps, in light of the harsh climate in Ma'rib Governorate and the extremely cold desert nature. It is worth mentioning that displaced households across the length and breadth of the camps are increasing and multiplying in light of the ongoing displacement. From several governorates of the Republic, the number of camps has now reached (204) camps for displaced people, and more than (400) thousand people live in those camps. All indicators warn of an imminent danger in light of the dwindling and diminishing humanitarian assistance. In the past two years, a number of camp residents, especially children, the elderly and the sick people have lost their lives due to complications from the deadly cold. It is worth noting that the capabilities and commitments of the local authority exceed the needs that are multiplying in light of the continuing pressure on basic services. humanitarian organizations and donors must work to provide safe and warm shelter, clothing and heating equipment for IDPs. Also improving the infrastructure in the camps to ensure their resistance to harsh weather condition and providing effective and safe heating methods, giving the needs of IDPs, ensure a decent and safe life for them during this difficult time.

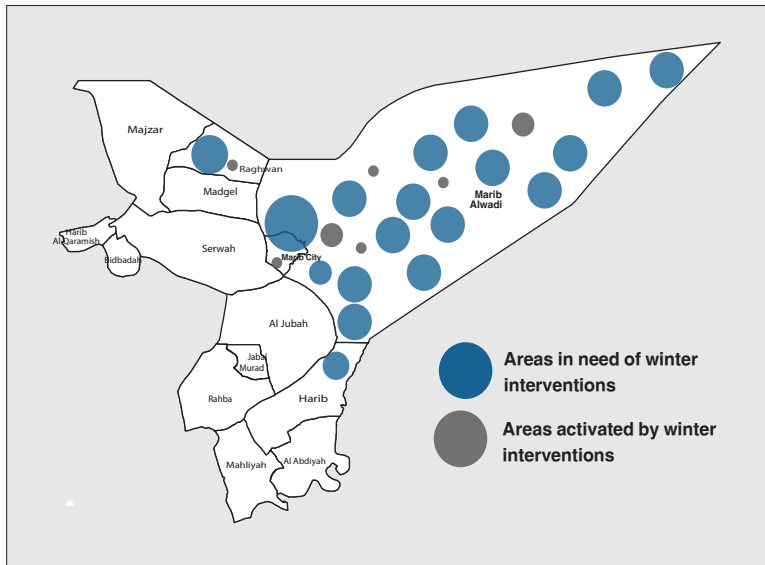
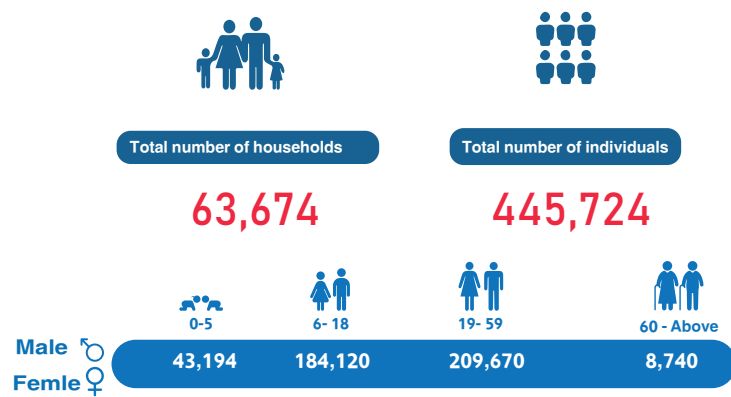
Most prominent needs in Ma'rib Governorate



Size of shelter and Non-Food Items needs in the camps

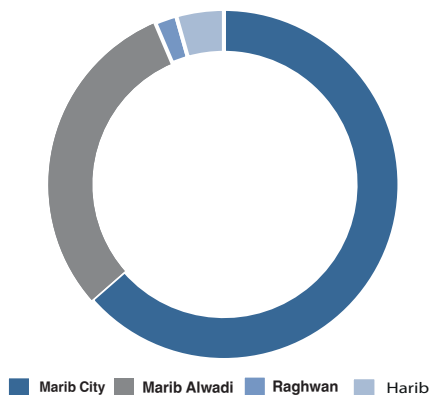

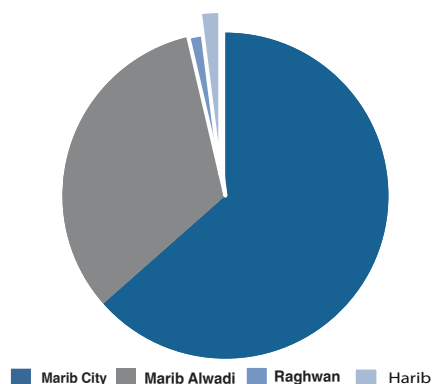


Winter needs of IDPs in the camps of Ma'rib Governorate - according to the directorate

Recommendation

We call on the government, humanitarian organizations and the international community to provide the necessary support and resources to improve the winter situation in displacement camps, provide displaced households with basic needs, and intervention effectively.

Working with the Executive Unit to improve emergency and temporary housing to be resistant to harsh weather conditions and equipped with safe heating methods, provide kits and winter clothes to maintain warmth, improve the situation of IDPs during the winter and providing them with a safe and sustainable environment

Working with the Health Office to rehabilitate hospitals and health centers in areas where IDPs are present, and providing the necessary treatments and health services, especially for the elderly who suffer from chronic diseases, as data indicates from the latest survey carried out by the Executive Unit last August indicate that there are more than (1,540) displaced individuals in camps suffering from chronic diseases .

Promoting awareness and educating IDPs about winter safety, preventing cold-related diseases, and how to use heating methods safely.

Necessity must be future planning to deal with winter in displacement camps by providing a sufficient stock of basic resources and necessary equipment and training partners on emergency response in the winter.
