

Recommendations

The Presidential Leadership Council, the Government – through the Council of Ministers – and the Executive Unit - Aden are urged to fulfill their responsibilities towards the affected HHs and to ensure the provision of immediate humanitarian assistance

The Humanitarian Coordinator in Yemen and all humanitarian partners are urged to step up efforts and increase response interventions to address the worsening conditions of IDPs in the camps

We call on humanitarian partners to accelerate response efforts to meet the urgent needs of those affected, including shelter, food, water, and other essential humanitarian services

CCCM Cluster partners are called upon to step up their efforts to rehabilitate and maintain shelters. Swift and effective solutions must be put in place to address the severe impact of rain and floods on displaced communities

We urge our Shelter Cluster partners to upgrade emergency shelters to transitional ones. These new shelters must be designed to withstand the severe desert climate

All displaced HHs are urged to take the necessary precautions during rainfall, flash floods, and thunderstorms, following the instructions shared throughout the camps
